FROM THE TREASURER

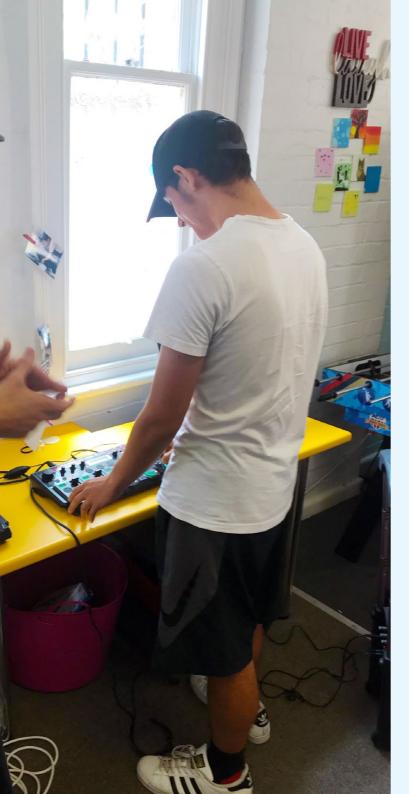
The GBB recorded an operating deficit for the year of \$21,274 compared to a deficit the previous year of \$277,148.

The GBB's number one focus is delivery of effective programs to children, youth and families. Expenditure on these totaled \$703,386, an increase of 8.5% over 2018. This growth is a financial indicator of the GBB's success in strategically broadening and deepening its services to clients. The demand for these services also continues to grow, so we fully expect these costs to increase year on year into the future.

As these costs rise, so must funding and 2019 saw a very pleasing 42% increase in fundraising revenue. This included the first year of distributions from the Foundation, but, as well, revenue from other sources grew by 7.6%. Of particular note is significant growth in support from various other Foundations and Corporates. Together with donors who support the GBB every year over many years, the outlook for the required income growth is encouraging. The GBB's investment in a new fundraising team will help meet that challenge to ensure the GBB's growth strategy can be financed.

Thank you to all the supporters, both new and long term, who make it possible for the GBB to continue and expand upon the great work it has done for so many years. Thank you also to the long standing Honorary Auditors, Deloitte Touche Tomatsu. The GBB is a Deductible Gift Recipient, so all donations are tax deductible.

All of these activities and more were done with a small, dynamic and passionate team who I am extremely fortunate to work with. It is their dedication, support, and love of the Brigade that makes my job so enjoyable.

Our wonderful supporters, some who have been supporting us for decades, are so important to our future. As The Girls & Boys Brigade receives no Government assistance to operate, we are indebted to the generosity, kindness and affection they have for the Brigade.

Part of our forward planning is to bring our supporters even closer to our organisation. We see ourselves as one big family at the Brigade, something we hope our supporters feel as well.

I am looking forward to the next stage of The Girls & Boys Brigade's journey, and with a committed and passionate Board of Directors to support us, look forward to sharing it with you too.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION OFFICER

What a busy year we have had, from only four part time staff in 2005, we now have six full time and two part time members of our team. With this increase brings added administration work, which we have simplified with a new payroll system, which makes staff more accountable for their time.

These additional staff also bring an increased demand for revenue. From 2005 our revenue has increased from \$250K to now well over \$1.25m, this increase is significant but reflects the increased service we give to our children, youth and their families.

In 2019 the Board established a Finance Committee; whose role is to oversee the Brigade's finances and administration. The Committee, as well as looking at the management of our investments, keeps a close eye on our cashflow for the next 12 months, to ensure the Brigade is able to operate, and predict when there may be problems in that timeframe.

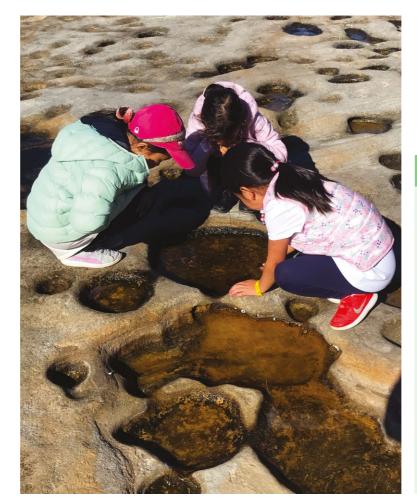
Much the same as we create a safe space for our children and youth, we have established a feeling of community and belonging that lets families know we are there for them and can help.
