Making Strides and Changing Lives City2Surf Team Raises Funds for The Girls & Boys Brigade

Just a few blocks from The Girls & Boys Brigade stands the historic Yirranma Place, a building rich in history much like our own centre. Since 2019, it has been transformed by the Paul Ramsay Foundation into a precinct for purpose focused on a shared mission: shifting conditions to stop disadvantage in Australia.

We are thrilled to announce that The Girls & Boys Brigade has been chosen by Yirranma Place as their charity partner for the 2024-2025 financial year. Building relationships can sometimes take time, but ours kicked off in an exhilarating way—literally, with a run!

This August, Yirranma Place was proudly represented by a team of twelve athletes who participated in the City2Surf, all fundraising for The Girls & Boys Brigade. Together, they collectively covered an impressive 168 kilometres, with each runner tackling 14 kilometres.

Their efforts raised a remarkable \$2,871 for the GBB which the Paul Ramsay Foundation generously matched dollar for dollar, bringing the total contribution to \$5,842.





Our team was privileged to celebrate this huge achievement with the Yirranma Place community at an amazing lunch at their building, put on by Two Good Co.

We are deeply moved by this incredible show of kindness and generosity. This support will significantly enhance our programs and serves as a powerful reminder of the impact communities can achieve when they unite for a common purpose.
